UNT

Does not play, but on the bench for all the games

Ryan Green

UT-Arlington (D1)

Has never played in 1 game, did do the high jump for track, but is MIA on any rosters this year

Of the Slinker recruits, the only 1 that may have been worthy of staying was El - but, she's at a JUCO, surely she had other offers from other schools, along with UNT - she had to go JUCO? The 2 that left for TWU are getting minimal minutes on a D2 squad. Green, that opted out of her scholarship is a dud. I would like to say this was not a "good squad" as suggested. Maybe as UNT fans, this is the type of talent/players you've become accustomed to... these players came from the "shallow end" of the talent pool... because 3 of the 4 freshman are better than the 2 at TWU and the one that is still not playing.

As far as the "suspensions" that occurred, well - since I have proven (on paper) that the above recruits were not up to "standard", I'm sure simply trusting SS judgement that "suspensions" were warranted is good enough for me. I guess I and other UNT fans have become to accustomed to "shallow end" recruiting to understand the dynamics of putting together a squad that has lost games by 30,44,39,59,48 and 68 points this year.

I am not sure you have proven anything on paper or otherwise. Again Slinker last class was questionable which was understandable under the circumstances, but I am not sure I can make the leap that there is a correlation between talent and discipline issues. At least, all of Slinker's last class got into school.

Unfortunately... I am unable to gain access to GMG. Probably better for everyone involved. The negativity on that board and the gloating that goes on after a loss - by "fans"... kind of disheartening.

You make some good points... I especially like the one about TWU beating UNT earlier this year. Bailey and JT did not play. So, what affect did they have on the outcome of that game? It was 2 freshman, a soph & a junior that got UNT back into that game at the end.

Might I ask, where was BJ while they were getting blown out the water in KY & TN? A senior leader (6th in the conference in scoring) that produced 7 & 3 points, respectively in those blow outs. If she were on any of the teams that we play against - she would be 4th or 5th option (at best). Someone wrote that the blowout games were lost in the first 5 minutes... I would like to add - where is the senior leadership, taking control of the younger players and getting everyone composed? A coach can only call but so many time-outs - the starters set the tone for the game.

You cannot even argue (with the exception of EI), that any of the players that left were D1 material. Green (we'll never know how good her skills were because she doesn't play ANYWHERE) asked for a release. Based on the things that were written, it's safe to infer that she had an over-bearing parent involved because within weeks of enrollment at UTA -

the mother went on & on about how much they loved UTA and how much Green wanted to be there. She's not even on the track roster this year. Something "smells" funny. That's the type of "loyalty" they had to UNT and with that attitude... "don't let the door hit you..."

As far as polls/ratings and the like are concerned - all are subjective. Like I said - once you get past the top 25 national recruits - it's anyone's game. So, on "paper" if Slinker had so many higher rated players - why didn't the win column reflect it? I would also like to point out that your coveted Amber Jackson was not a consistent starter - even as a Red Shirt Freshman - until her sophomore year. If she was THAT NICE... I'm just saying... Let's compare apples to apples. Godbolt has only missed 3 starts as a TRUE FRESHMAN (18 yrs old) has 268 points on the year so far. As a RS Freshman (that means Jackson was at least 19), Jackson had 14 starts and averaged 7 ppg and finished her first year with 205 points. Jackson was "technically" a sophomore... The way you tell it - I was thinking Jackson should have been the next WNBA first round draft pick. I guess you're right - beauty is in the eye of the beholder... cause I'm not really seeing what you see. Were you referring to the "developed" player with disciplinary issues?

Let's talk about the other Freshman that you referenced. As a True Freshman, Lee averaged 11 mins and 2.4 ppg and finished her season with 66 points. If I were to match up by size/position - I would say the closest "fit" would be Cuffie who is averaging 13.8 minutes per game and 4.2 ppg and all ready has 100 points on the season. Hall, as a True Freshman averaged 6.7 mins per game and 2.4 ppg with 55 points after her freshman year. We can go with either Brown (12.6 mins per game/ 2.2 ppg /43 season points) or Hawkins (11.3 mins per game/ 1.5 ppg / 31 season points). So, I can see where maybe Brown or Hawkins could be comparable... but considering the disciplinary issues that Hall encountered her Senior year... I'll take Brown & Hawkins. Escalera came in as a transfer so, we could probably match her up with Hudson, which - is a stretch - just because Hudson is battling some injuries... but for arguments sake - Escalera averaged 24.2 mins per game her first year, 6.9 ppg, and had 220 points for the season. Hudson is averaging 19.6 mins per game, 6.6 ppg, and has 92 points so far this season (she's played in 14 of 24 games). If I add the other 69 points we could assume she would score if she had played (based on her ppg average), she would have 161 points on the season thus far (assuming, of course). If I compared her to Hughes who averages 24.1 mins per game, 8 ppg, and has 193 points on the season so far, better on paper?

I believe there is more upside with the SS recruits. In my opinion, of course. :laugh: I haven't heard of any "suspensions" thus far, so it's obvious the players respect the coach and the rules.

So, hold your ground - I enjoy the banter. I cannot agree on alot of your points just because I have no loyalty to Slinker or any of her players (except Torru) and even though the team has suffered some devastating losses - is not the "be all - end all" to what lies ahead for the future. This team is much more talented than what existed and after graduation - they will be an even better team.
